

**Students Hoping To Attend U.S. Universities Should Register  
For Next ACT Exam By May 7, 2010**

The next ACT college admission and placement exam, a requirement for students planning to pursue their undergraduate degree at most colleges and universities in the United States, will be administered locally at the International Academic Center in Belgrade on June 12, 2010. Students who wish to take the exam on this date must register online at [www.actstudent.org](http://www.actstudent.org) by May 7, 2010.

To register, students must first establish a free ACT student Web account. After creating this account, students should click the “Register to Test” link and follow the instructions on the Web screens to complete their registration. Payment is required to complete the registration and must be made by valid credit card.

The international registration fee is \$58 for the traditional ACT (with no writing test) and \$73 for the ACT Plus Writing (which includes the optional writing exam). The ACT Plus Writing is offered only on the October, December, and April international test dates in 2009-2010.

Some U.S. colleges and universities require that students submit a writing score, but many do not. A list of colleges and universities that require the writing test can be found at [www.actstudent.org/writing](http://www.actstudent.org/writing).

The ACT is the only exam accepted for admission purposes by every single four-year college and university in the United States, including all Ivy League institutions.

The ACT is a curriculum-based achievement exam that measures what students have learned in school. It consists of four required multiple-choice tests in English, mathematics, reading and science and the optional essay writing test.
